Wills, Powers of Attorney, Guardianships made easy!

Is your Will and Power of Attorney up to date? Is it something you've been meaning to do, but just hasn't happened?



You can do it for free, in a friendly, social environment. On **Saturday 10th October, 2pm-5pm**, Matrix member, Colleen Woolley will conduct a workshop on what you need to do to get your affairs in order. Colleen has been a Justice of the Peace (JP) for 16 years and specialises in helping people organise their Enduring Powers of Attorney, both Financial and Medical, as well as Enduring Power of Guardianship. She provides all the paperwork needed and is qualified to witness documents for you.

All you have to do is determine who will act for you. Obviously, this must be someone you trust implicitly as they will have control of all your affairs. Preferably, you will have two people to act for you; say, your partner (if you have one) and a second, backup person just in case you and your partner were both crossing the road in front of that tram. Ideally, both those people would be available

(and can also do their own Powers) at the same time as they will need to sign that they accept the responsibility. Simple Wills can also be done.

Lesbian Health Focus Group- Participants Needed



Some of you may have met young Annabelle and Bec at the dance on Saturday. They and two of their colleagues, Alyssa and Anne, are Physiotherapy PhD students, who as part of their doctorate are doing a project about how to engage with marginalised communities to improve the health outcomes of that group. Three of these young women are lesbian, and the fourth experienced first- hand on a placement how a dying lesbian's partner was treated very poorly by hospital staff. She resolved that she wanted to do something to improve health matters for lesbians.

They want to talk to us about how we perceive our health needs, in order to create a health promotion project that will be relevant and useful for us. Their focus group will

Human rights and freedoms for all?

At the recent United Nations Summit that has just been held in New York, a draft set of global Sustainable Development Goals were agreed on by the countries present. The goals include statements which address discrimination and violence against the LGBTI community.

LOTL's Annalese Davis reports: -

At an annual United Nations meeting, a dozen agencies issued a joint call imploring countries to end violence against LGBT individuals. The goals are clearly defined in The Sustainable Development Goals program. The UN outlines "ambitious targets" relating to poverty, equality, and climate change for the 193 member states. The goals pledge that "human rights and fundamental freedoms are enjoyed by all, without discrimination on grounds of race, ethnicity, colour, sex, age, language, religion, culture, migration status, political or other opinion, national or social origin, economic situation, birth, disability or other status." 76 states with laws criminalizing same-sex relationships between consenting adults have been urged to repeal the laws. The statement addresses how "violence and discrimination against LGBT individuals have far-reaching effects on society and even economic growth."
